

At A Glance: DOMTAR'S DRYDEN MILL







Domtar's Dryden Mill is located in Northwestern Ontario, along the Wabigoon Chain of Lakes. Originally discovered in the Canadian gold rush during the 1800s, Dryden is known for its diverse culture and outdoor adventures, even while representing the smallest community in the entire province of Ontario. With their many natural riches, the Dryden community was well suited for pulp and paper production, and represents the ideal place to call home for mill workers and outdoor enthusiasts, alike.

The Basics:

- The Domtar Dryden Mill is located in Dryden, Ontario and is one of Domtar's 13 pulp and paper mills in North America.
- The mill has one pulp line with an annual pulp capacity of 328,000 tons.
- The Dryden Mill produces Northern Bleached Softwood Kraft pulp, which
 is suitable for a variety of end-uses, including premium paper towel and
 tissue, as well as specialty paper grades.



- Domtar's Dryden Mill has an estimated regional economic impact of \$603.4 million.
- The Dryden Mill supports 353 local jobs.
- The Dryden Mill is the largest employer in Dryden.
