



At A Glance: DOMTAR'S HAWESVILLE MILL



Named for Richard Hawes who provided the land on which the city was formed, Hawesville is located on the Ohio River in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. From the very beginning, Hawesville's location on the Mississippi River's largest tributary helped support industries like coal mining and pulp and paper manufacturing. In fact, Abraham Lincoln won his first law case here in 1827, defending himself against charges of operating a ferry across the Ohio River without a license.

The Basics:

- The Domtar Hawesville Mill is located in Hawesville, KY and is one of Domtar's 13 pulp and paper mills in North America.
- The mill has one pulp line and two paper machines, with an annual paper production capacity of 572,000 tons and an annual pulp production capacity of 425,000 tons.
- The Hawesville Mill produces Xerographic, offset, EDP Facestock, Engineering Laser Bond and Forms Bond.



ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTIONS:

- Domtar's Hawesville Mill has an estimated regional economic impact of \$1.5 billion.
- The Hawesville Mill supports 451 local jobs.
- The Hawesville Mill is the second largest employer in Hawesville.
