



At A Glance: DOMTAR'S WINDSOR MILL



Windsor is a small town in the Eastern Townships Region of Quebec, Canada, whose name honors the residence of the royal family in the United Kingdom. Pulp and paper production has been a part of the town's history since 1864, when the Windsor Mill became Canada's first chemical wood-pulp facility. The region's great depth of experience for this craft ensured substantial growth.

The Basics:

- The Domtar Windsor Mill is located in Windsor, Quebec and is one of Domtar's 13 pulp and paper mills in North America.
- The mill has one pulp line and two paper machines, with an annual paper production capacity of 650,000 tons and an annual pulp production capacity of 447,000 tons.
- The Windsor Mill produces commercial printing papers, copy paper, envelope, and recycled content.
- The mill owns 400,000 acres of forest lands in Quebec, all certified to the standards of ISO 14001, FSC and SFI.



ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTIONS:

- Domtar's Windsor Mill has an estimated regional economic impact of \$1.6 billion.
- The Windsor Mill supports 850 local jobs.
- The Windsor Mill is the largest employer in the town of Windsor, Quebec.

Positive Environmental Impact and Community Investments:

- Almost 50% of the fiber is FSC Certified and 100% of the wood comes from controlled sources.
- Nearly 75% of the residues are beneficial reuse.
- Almost 90% of the energy produced at the mill comes from renewable resources.
- In 2013, the Windsor Mill contributed \$48,000 in grassroots giving to the local community.
- Through ecological donations totaling over 12,000 acres, Domtar and the Windsor Mill have helped preserve some of Quebec's most prized forestlands, ensuring these unique ecosystems remain unspoiled for future generations.
- The Windsor Mill is one of the lowest rates of water consumption in North America for a mill of this category.
